JUNKER JU-52

South African Historic Flight (previously SAA Historic Flight) is managed and operated by aviation enthusiasts within the framework of the Transnet Heritage Foundation. It strives for the preservation of aviation history, and, in particular, the passenger airline history of South Africa.

Our fleet of aircraft: JUNKER JU-52 - ZS -AFA

Although over 5000 of this type of aircraft were originally built, "Tante Ju", as she is affectionately known, is one of the six airworthy examples left in the world. She is painted in the livery of the thirties, to represent the first JUNKER JU-52 of South African Airways.

The Junker can accommodate 16 passengers on pleasure flights, and 12 on charter flights.

DOUGLAS DC-3 DAKOTA - ZS-BXF AND ZS-BXI

These DC-3's were built in 1943, and served within South African Airways and the South African Air Force. ZS-BXF has been restored to represent the DC-3's when they began service with SAA during the 1940's. The livery of ZS-BXJ is from the time the aircraft were withdrawn from service with SAA in the early 1970's.

Both Dakotas seat 24 passengers.

DOUGLAS DC-4 SKYMASTER - ZS-BMH AND ZS-AUB

At the end of 1945 SAA negotiated the purchase of a fleet of DC-4's and on 1 May 1946 a non-stop service between Johannesburg and Cape Town was introduced. Shortly afterwards, the DC-4's were introduced on the Springbok service to supplement the joint SAA-BOAC Avro York flights. The Skymaster flight on the route Johannesburg - Nairobi - Khamusam-Tripoli - Hurne (near Bournemouth) took about 36 hours.

The aircraft seats 50 passengers in a Business Class configuration.

The DC-4's range of 3 000 km puts it in easy range of East and Control

Africa, and the many spectacular islands in the Indian Ocean.
